Message from the President

I am honored and humbled to lead the IISc AANA Midwest Chapter with the help of a vibrant team of dedicated volunteers. Our Executive Committee members (see page 8) are very active, passionate, dedicated, and committed to increase the chapter activities, such as membership outreach, organizing alumni get together, fundraising for women fellowship, and giving back to our beloved alma mater IISc.

Following the mission and vision of the IISc Alumni Association of North America (AANA), the Midwest Chapter meets once a month to discuss how to connect with IISc and help our alma mater and alumni. Many significant activities took place in the past year. Undergraduate Fellowships to Enhance Women in STEM

IISc being one of the premier research institutions in India suffers from the perils experienced by most institutes of higher education in terms of under-representation of women in STEM fields. Over the past several years, IISc has actively sought various initiatives to increase enrollment of female students in different disciplines including different scholarship schemes available to incoming female students. The esteemed alums of this institution also discussed various ways to eradicate this inequality and initiated a need-based scholarship program to support women undergraduates for the full length of their degree program. Several donors from IISc Alumni Midwest Chapter came forward to raise funds that eventually supported 3 women undergraduate scholars raising the number of female undergraduates admitted to the program to 20% in 2022. These students came from various parts of the country and were chosen based on merit and need. The recipients expressed their ecstasy and joy in receiving the scholarship and shared how this needed assistance will help them towards reaching their aspiration goals.

Note of Thanks from IISc

Indian Institute of Science (IISc) has a legacy of more than 115 years and has always been known for academic excellence and rigor. The undergraduate (UG) four-year program, B.S. (Research), has been a flagship program of IISc, where research methodologies are integrated into the UG curriculum. This program has always attracted the best students across India. About seven years ago, a review of this program made the faculty body of IISc realize the gender imbalance among UG students, where women students were less than 20%. This led to the Faculty Senate approve supernumerary quota of 20% for women students to ensure that at least one in five students in the UG program will be women, requiring the UG program to attract women students from new venues. While students are admitted using KVPY, JEE, and NEET, those admitted through JEE and NEET were not provided any fellowship. IISc decided to provide fellowships to those students from its own resources. To make it sustainable and attractive, the institute reached out to the alumni for contributions towards women fellowships. IISc AANA Midwest Chapter rose to the occasion and provided funds for three women fellowships. It is heartening to see that all women candidates admitted with JEE and NEET qualifications are now supported through the alumni instituted fellowships, and IISc AANA Midwest Chapter leads from the front. Moreover, this year the women candidates admitted into the UG program crossed 20% and the credit should go to all alumni who contributed selflessly to the gender parity mission of IISc. Personally, I wish to thank all contributors of IISc AANA Midwest Chapter Women Fellowships, and we need more champions.

Report on AANA National Meeting in Atlanta on August 26-27, 2022

The National meeting of IISc Alumni Association of North America (AANA) was held on August 26-27, 2022 in Atlanta, Georgia, USA. The theme of the two-day meeting-cum-conference was 'Advances in Science and Technology' with the main objective of bringing together many of the IISc Alumni from the US, particularly Eastern region. The meeting was inaugurated by Dr. Rama Chellappa and Ms. Mrinalini Lakshminarayan (Co-Chairs, AANA Board of Directors) and Dr. Kamalesh Ruppa, Convenor of the conference. Dr. Sethuraman Panchanathan (Director, National Science Foundation) delivered the Plenary Lecture, which was very informative and vibrant. Dr. Govindan Rangarajan (Director, IISc) dedicated his time to attend the conference and delivered a keynote lecture by sharing the impressive growth and magnificent plans to establish a medical school at IISc. The new IISc-Emory University collaboration and the importance on developing a Medical Research Institute were well explained by Drs. Amara Rama Rao, Rafi Ahmed, and Nikhil Singla. Additionally, Dr. Tummala Rao presented India's vision for Electronics R&D and the role of IISc.

The conference had three sessions with highly respected and talented speakers as panelists and subject matter experts as moderators. Session 1 on Health and Biological Sciences was moderated by Drs. Sampath Ramachandiran, and Ramireddy Bommireddy. The panelists Drs. Sooryanarayana Varambally, Periasamy Selvaraj, and Amara Rama Rao led a very engaging discussion covering cancer biology and vaccine science. Session 2 (Concept to Market & Entrepreneurship), moderated by Ms. Mrinalini Lakshminarayan and Ms. Aparna Kasani, was very thought-provoking with industry experts Dr. Vijay Chandru, Selva Nataraj, and Rita Khanna as the panelists. Session 3 (AI & Machine Learning) was moderated by Drs. Rama Chellapa and Sajal Das. This panel, although the last event of the conference, attracted great attention as the topic of AI bridges all Science and Technology areas. The panelists for AI & ML were Drs. Nageswara Rao, Uma Kishore Ramachandiran, Ashok Goel, Anant Madabushi, and Ms. Vasuki Arumugam.

At the tail end of COVID-19 season, having 70 participants was impressive. The conference organizers were thankful to the Georgia Institute of Technology for providing their state-of-the-art conference facility.

Membership Outreach

The Midwest Chapter reached out to several constituencies both to inform alumni about the rejuvenation of IISc Alumni engagement in the region and to enhance the membership list that was received from the prior Midwest leadership team. These activities were led by Vasuki Arumugam in Chicago and supported by several alumni including Shivakumar Sastry in Cleveland/Akron area. A new website activity was initiated. Vasuki represents our Chapter to the AANA's communications and website team.

Initial discussions and conversations with fellow alumni indicate a strong preference for activities that will allow the alumni to have meaningful interactions and social gatherings to complement their career interests. Talks by highly visible speakers that also allow ample opportunities for the Chapter members to interact with the speakers would be very welcome and create a community that can contribute back to our Alma Mater and support new generations of students in finding exciting career opportunities and settling down in the Midwest region.

We welcome new volunteers with fresh perspectives to help with outreach activities.
