## IISc AANA Global Conference - Students' Perspective

It was our first US visit, or any visit outside India for all four of us-Krishna, Amrit, Anubhav and Pankaj - and obviously we were very excited. What we were not expecting was to see such a large gathering of Indians, not only Indians, but people from our own Institute in the heartland of America. We don't know whether AANA organizers thought about this or not, but the city of Chicago shares a special connection with India and especially with IISc. Incidentally, it was the city where Swami Vivekananda gave his famous speech; and while travelling to Chicago, he met Jamshetji Tata in his ship and suggested that he set up a research institute in India; what we now call IISc. So coming to Chicago was a lifetime experience in itself, especially as a current student of IISc. Further, meeting our alumni and listening to their inspiring talks added to that experience.

We got to know a lot of alumni/alumnae who were too glad to meet us, and shared their experiences of IISc and life in the US. They would soon get nostalgic about IISc, shared their bittersweet experiences of their student life and all of them were keen to know how IISc is doing these days. It was quite evident that in spite of being so far, all of them had a special place for IISc in their hearts; they cared for it and were ready to extend any possible support to their alma mater to help it grow.

There was also a faculty delegation from IISc attending this conference. To witness and participate in the panel discussions with alumni/alumnae on building bridges between alums and IISc was one of the most useful things that came out of this conference in our opinion. It was especially heartening to see the contributions made by the alumni for aiding education of under privileged children in India. The session was chaired by Dr. Gajanana Birur who was himself involved in various such activities through BEFC foundation. We too got to present similar activities going on in the campus through our group Note Book Drive. There was also a very informative talk by Dr. R Chidamabaram who provided the current status of science and technology in India and the efforts made by Government of India to promote science, especially in connecting various institutes the National Knowledge Network. We also had the opportunity to meet with Sam Pitroda, the former chairman of National Knowledge Commission who was at the conference.

Finally, we would like to thank the organizers, especially Prof. Sunil Kumar, Dr. Arkal Shenoy and Dr. Gajanana Birur for inviting us to be part of the Global Conference and funding our US travel and stay in Chicago. We are also thankful to Prof. S. Mohan for coordinating the visit with AANA organizers. Overall, it was a very memorable conference. We hope there can be more such platforms for interaction and may the ties between our alumni and alma mater become stronger by each passing day.

## IISc AANA Global Conference - A Senior AANA Member's Perspective

This was the first time I attended such a conference, having missed the first one held in Bay Area in California back in 2007. I was in India at that time and read in the newspapers that President Abdul Kalam had given inspiring address to our alumni.

I must confess that I was overwhelmed to find IISc alumni from all over the U.S. Many of these alumni were leaders in front line technologies at national labs, at universities and research institutions, and in the industry. They ranged in age from 30 to 80 years and all of them were bubbling with energy and ideas for the future. I felt very proud to see Dr. Chidambaram, Principal Scientific Advisor to Government of India (a 1956-61 IISc alumnus and five years junior to me, 1948-51 ET) and other distinguished faculty members from IISc led by Associate Director Prof. Balakrishnan, who was representing the Director. Prof. Balakrishnan outlined the new proposed undergraduate program and expansion and the expansion of the existing departments. He also gave details of a new campus located about 240 km from Bangalore and spoke of the multidisciplinary approach such as application of mathematics to life sciences, bioengineering, material sciences, and nanotechnology to solve their problems and the faculty members cutting across red tape and meeting their counterparts and solving problems on person to person basis.

Another high tech development at IISc is networking in India though an optic fibre network connection with U.K. and other European laboratories, soon to be extended to U.S. and Canada. As decided by Government of India, IISc will be the coordinating agency for maintaining this linkage between educational institutions abroad. This system is already in operation and is a singular honour for IISc Bangalore.

The Chicago Global Conference was meticulously planned and executed and Prof. Sunil Kumar and his associates should be fully credited for making our stay and the participation in the discussions and interactions a memorable experience. The food arrangements for breakfast lunch, and dinners were excellent and very healthy and flavourful and kept us full of energy and high spirits. It was a moment of pride and joy to be felicitated as the senior most alumni present in this conference and I could talk to my fellow alumni of various ages with the youngest being from the 2012 batch.

I did not realize earlier, what a heavy crown Dr. Arkal Shenoy, Chair AANA Board has to wear and I wish him success in his ongoing projects. Both Dr. Arkal Shenoy and his spouse Dr. Vasanthi Shenoy were more than gracious and generous to look after this old alumni throughout his stay in Chicago, not only brought him from Midway Airport and saw him off at the Airport. How can I thank them enough!! My prayer: Let IISc grow and develop into a top Global Institute and IIScAANA which has a large number of alumni in North America will play a vital role in the coming years and improve human life worldwide.

### LIFELAB - An Innovative NGO for Science Education Outreach by IISc Alumnus P. Sridhar

LIFE LAB is an NGO cofounded by P. Sridhar (2010) with Rishikesh (2011), and Lewitt (NIT Nagpur 2011) in Pune. Sridhar was the coordinator of NBD at IISc during 2009-2010 at IISc. It was founded in 2012 with the purpose of enabling school educators to create self-sustainable activity based learning platforms for students to maximize learning potential. This approach nurtures team work, problem solving, and interpersonal skill-sets. Life-lab conducts a two year intervention program for the schools, through which, it provides infrastructural & consultancy support to science educators at both planning and execution level & conduct Impact studies to make informed decisions. Life-lab is currently working with 20 schools in Pune district of Maharashtra, India; impacting the lives of more than 10000 children. Life-lab is the recipient of the prestigious Education Innovation Fund For India - '12 award by Hewlett Packard & is supported by Unltd India, Plus Trust, Thermax, Ekya & Teach For India.

#### A visit to Akshaya Patra Kitchen

Ms. Parminder Sawhney, the Akshaya Patra (AP) Coordinator in Chicago was a panellist in the 'Education Outreach to Underserved Children in Rural and Urban Schools' session during the 2013 IISC AANA Global Conference. Her talk inspired AANA members and also IISC NBD students to learn more about the AP kitchen in Bangalore. The visit was coordinated by AP-- Ms Piyali Dutta in the U.S. and Mr N. One fine morning (not the pseudo morning I wake up to every day but the real 5.00 am morning) a few of us from Notebook Drive (NBD), IISc and BEFC, under the able guidance of Dr. Gajanana Birur, visited The Akshaya Patra Foundation kitchen situated at the heart of Bangalore, the power of the meagre four-letter word, food, unfolded in front of us and we could visualize how everything pirouetted around it. The Akshaya Patra Foundation started in June 2000 with the vision that "No child in India should be deprived of education due to hunger", providing mid-day meals to 1500 children spreading across five schools in Bangalore. The overwhelming response thus received led to the impetus growth of the Foundation which now reaches out to 1.3 million children across the country, every day.

And the kitchen at Bangalore North reaching out to over 1, 00,000 children across some 500 schools was no less than a battle field, all prepared for the go. The processing room had vegetable peelers, Sāmbhar makers, and rice boilers all dedicated to provide food for thought. Then there were granaries and cold storage rooms flowing with supplies. With bio-fuel units and large furnaces, the kitchen had literally transformed into a mechanical laboratory. While Vinay Kumar of Akshaya Patra Foundation was taking us through the technical details, I could only hear the merry cheers of the million cherubs when they lay their hands on the food. Their heart-warming smiles and laughs rang clearly in my ears. I could all of a sudden visualize the million happy faces adorned with those twinkling pair of eyes and a joyous feeling percolated through my heart.

The kitchen was a power-house. It was highly mechanized but the purpose of it all snatched away all the limelight. How could anything on earth be greater than providing food to the hungry? But what really struck me was the confluence of science and service to the society. We always tend to keep our educational qualifications for the sole purpose of finding a handsomely paid job. We scarcely try to implement the technical things we learn in the process of obtaining a degree in philanthropic purposes. And at the Akshaya Patra kitchen I could see the opportunity to put the million equations we had learnt to bring another million smiles.

After the tour de kitchen came to an end, the best part came about (yeah, for me it was) - the food tasting session. And the food, trust me, could not have been better. And hence we could safely conclude that The Akshaya Patra Foundation did not compromise quality for quantity. A thousand dreams and as many aspirations, the urge to reach the zenith, the tenacity to make it big, a hope to fly high are all being fuelled by a stomach full of "food".

Three cheers to The Akshaya Patra Foundation for giving happy endings to million stories across the subcontinent. May it grow bigger with each passing day and spread the smile further and wider.

#### Treasured Memories of NASA/JPL Visit

There is one place I always dreamt of visiting. Yes, it was the Jet Propulsion Laboratory of National Aeronautics and Space Administration. The mere entry near the main gate was enthralling. After waiting in the lounge area for a while, I was all set to see the place and the many contributions of this place to the world. We started with a short movie giving general information about JPL and NASA. The fact that the staff was kind enough to screen the movie for the lone visitor more than overwhelmed me.

Dr. Gajanana Birur took me through the various space exploration missions one by one with a brief background of each. We went through models of several missions (Cassini, Voyagers, Mars Pathfinder, etc., etc.). I was guite amazed when Dr. Birur mentioned that the Voyagers have completed their journey through our solar system and are now providing information beyond it. From there we proceeded to the place where engineers were working on the upcoming missions. They were all in their white suits working in the sterile zone. Next was the data collection center. The many monitors displayed provided details about all the current missions of the JPL. While I was already overawed by the things I had seen by then, little was I aware that the biggest surprise of the day was yet to come. As we entered the 'Mars Yard', a wonder was waiting for us. It was the working replica of the Curiosity rover in action on the simulated Martian surface. I experienced the mission through which I came to know more about NASA and JPL and had been hearing about from Dr. Birur at IISc and following closely for the last 2-3 years. The visit concluded at the JPL store with some memorabilia and games. I realized that space research has many technological advances and innovations and benefitted greatly to humankind. This has helped me support more funding for science and technology in general and space research (especially during the recent launch of Indian Mars orbiter mission) in particular in a much better manner. Finally, I would like to thank Dr. Birur for making this visit possible.
